"Three Days In Rosemont" series of images photographes times Days in Rosemont' is a series of images photographed by the local photographer over a three-day period in the spring of 2008 on a property in the rural township of Rosemont, N.J. The images, many of which are being shown for the first time in the U.S. portray a disso of 166. time in the U.S., portray a slice of life in rural America that few have every

Founded in 1719, and with only six registered single-family homes, Rose registered single-family nornes, Rose-mont, located between New York City and Philadelphia, is worlds apart from typical urban life in America. This body of work by Paton in-

cludes an overview and detailed largescale images and portraits from an outdoor auction of over 150 vintage and classic cars, which were left to slowly deteriorate on the property of an elderly resident for over 35 years; a car cemetery of sorts.

The portraits of the people attend-ing the auction on day three of this shoot that are included in this series accentuate the unique nural sphere and a sense of place that few have seen or could imagine.

An 80-acre former chicken farm and an American Revolutionary War Cemetery visibly border the subject property documented in the photographic series

appointment. Wendy Paton Photograms Liter-features a selection of Paton's most recent series of dynamic, abstract, gelatin silver Photograms using the literary and artistic world of books as her subject.

Utilizing the age-old photographic process also known as camera-less photography, the artist has created a visual language that boldly emphasiz-es the rapid change of both the literary and photographic mediums.

Selections from Photograms erary have previously been exhibited at Art Karlsruhe and In Focus Galerie, Germany, and most recently Art Source Loft, NYC. This is the first time Paton is exhibiting this recent work in the Bucks County area.

Paton's work, including selections of Photograms Literary and selections of Three Days in Rosemont, has been exhibited in solo U.S. and international gallery and museum exhibitions
